Speaker: Masako Maeda (Kyushu University) Yoichi Miyamoto (Osaka University) Talk Title: Focus movement approach to bare whstripping in Japanese

In this talk, we examine the stripping construction that includes a wh-remnant with focus interpretation (wh-stripping). Saito (2017) argues that wh-indeterminate phrases in Japanese are operators that need to be specified for quantificational force. They undergo covert movement to the specifier of ka or mo to yield the interrogative or concessive interpretation. Saito (2021) further observes that wh-indeterminate phrases are not necessarily associated with ka/mo. Saito argues that such "bare" wh-phrases undergo focus movement to FocP in the CP periphery. Extending Saito's (2021) analysis, we argue that wh-stripping is derived from the focalization of a wh-indeterminate phrase, followed by TP-deletion. We present empirical support for the current analysis by observing that wh-stripping exhibits different properties from those of clefts.
